

# Do you want to play soccer in College?

The National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) is the governing body for College Sports. The first step toward an Athletic Scholarship is registering with the NCAA Eligibility Center. It is suggested that you register during your Junior Year.

To be successful in college, students need to be prepared for college coursework. In Division I and II, the NCAA sets academic initial-eligibility standards that consider GPA, standardized test scores, core courses taken in high school, and the grades earned in those core courses. Division III schools hold student-athletes to the same standards for the institution they're enrolling in. All student-athletes also must meet the unique acceptance requirements of the college or university they plan to attend (which may exceed NCAA standards). Learn more at [NCAA.org](http://NCAA.org).

## PETERS TOWNSHIP HIGH SCHOOL SOCCER BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP

Every year, the PTHS Soccer Boosters awards a \$1,000 scholarship to a male and female player for their efforts during high school. The awards are chosen by a committee and distributed to the players at Senior Awards Night in the spring. Applications must be submitted by November 15, 2025, to the Athletic Director's office. Graduating seniors on the Varsity team who wish to apply need to have a cumulative (six semesters) 3.0 or higher GPA, be involved in all the various team programs, and exhibit team spirit, a positive attitude, and good citizenship. They must intend to further their education by attending a post-high school institution, and their family must be a member of the PTHS Soccer Boosters.

### Application submission deadline is November 15, 2025

- Scholarships will be announced at the Soccer Banquet.
- Scholarships will be announced to the players in the spring on Senior Awards Night.

### Boosters Scholarship Guidelines and Criteria

1. Cumulative (six semesters) GPA 3.0 or higher.
2. Must be a graduating senior on the Varsity Soccer Team.
3. Involvement in team programs (clinics, conditioning, weightlifting, fundraising, etc.).
4. Exhibits team spirit and a positive attitude (games, practice, clinics, pre-season, etc.).
5. Exhibits good citizenship (high school office will review any disciplinary infractions).
6. Family is a member of the Soccer Boosters.
7. Intends to further education by attending a post-high school institution.
8. Additional consideration (all other being equal):
  - Leadership: Team Captain, Club Officer, etc.
  - Involvement in school activities and community service (club sports, volunteer work, jobs, etc.)
9. Input by the soccer coaching staff
